Simply print out enough of the Inkscape files so that you have one "Base" and 11 of the "2-12" gores. A "gore" is one slice of a globe. One more tip: when cutting the interlocking tabs, angle each tab inward just a touch, so that the end of the tab is slightly smaller than its base. This will greatly ease assembly.
